











Madison High School is experiencing its first year with wrestling as a major sport. It has been added in an effort to bring a complete sports program to the school. Wrestling is under the supervision of Mr. Meyer. Approximately twenty boys are working out in daily practice.

A varsity wrestling meet is composed of twelve separate matches, classed according to weight divisions. These classes range from 95 pounds to the heavyweight class which includes anyone up to 235 pounds. Matches are six minutes long. Each match is divided into three two minute periods. At the beginning of the match both wrestlers start on their feet. At the start of the second period one wrestler is on his hands and knees with the other on top of him. At the start of the third period this is reversed.

Unless a fall occurs, the match is decided on a point basis. A wrestler receives two points for the original takedown in the first period. One point is scored for an escape from a hold, while two points are scored for a reversal--when a wrestler escapes from a hold and in turn gets a hold on his opponent. Two points are scored for a predicament, which occurs when the opponent is on his back and is in a bit of trouble. A near fall--when a wrestler is close but not completely pinned--scores three points.

Since 1926, students at Madison High School have been under the guiding hand of Principal Connor K. Salm. Now that Mr. Salm is leaving the halls of M.H.S. for an earned retirement, we pause to pay him the honor which he well deserves.

Mr. Salm came here when there were only winding gravel roads coming into a sleepy river town. The high school had an enrollment of 253 students, and the high school was located in the building that is now the American Legion post. In 1928, the new Broadway school was built and in this building, Mr. Salm capably directed the students of M.H.S.

The success of basketball while Mr. Salm was principal led to his long service on the IHSAA council, culminating in 1959 when he became president.

Mr. Salm has been a leader in civic activities. He has been active in the local Kiwanis Club, serving as state governor of Kiwanis in 1939.

Many of Mr. Salm's students have gone on to success in life--many, in fact, are now teaching in Madison schools or are leaders on the business and civic scene in the city.

To the educator who has guided us for 36 years, we, the students of M.H.S., and speaking for the past students, wish him the best of luck and want to say a genuine, heartfelt, "Thank you, Mr. Salm."
