M.C.H.S. Observes Centennial

Chalk up one hundred graduating classes in the annals of Madison Consolidated High School as the seniors of 1963 receive their diplomas.

The first class, graduated in 1855, consisted of Mary D. and Sarah Reid (sisters), Letitia M. Smith, and James R. Ely. Since that time the classes have dropped and grown in size. In 1864 one girl, Anna Langtry Burton, was graduated. In 1963 the largest class ever, graduated, containing 153 seniors. For several years, however, there were no graduating seniors. For instance, due to the change from a three-year to a four-year high school, no class was graduated in 1893. The years in which there were no graduates account for the fact that only one hundred classes have graduated from the high school, which is actually one hundred and eight years old.

Madison has had some trouble, too. From August, 1857, to September, 1861, the public schools were closed because certain taxpayers felt that schools were an unnecessary extravagance. Also they were plagued by the ever-present problem of over-crowdedness. The school was forced to move its headquarters in 1877, 1928, and again in 1960.

Then there were the progressive times. During the 1880-1890 decade, the superintendency became a continuing and professional job. Dr. James H. Martin held the post for nine of the ten years and is given credit for having reorganized the schools and strengthened the position of the high school in the community.

of Graduating Classes

The 1890's must be regarded as the years in which the extra-curricular activities really "arrived" in Madison. Much of the credit for the enlargement of the school functions must go to Charles M. McDaniels, successor to George C. Hubbard (1890-1892) as principal, and to David M. Geeting, who became Superintendent of Schools in March, 1892. In 1895 the first school annual, THE APOTHEGM, was published and three years later replaced by a school paper.

It wasn't until 1930-1931, when the high school enrollment passed the three hundred mark, that the faculty was increased from three to fifteen. This occurred at the building on Broadway and First, whose total capacity was three hundred students.

The courses available to M.C.H.S. students have gradually increased until there are now five offered. These are as follows: Academic, Business, General, Home Economics, and Industrial Arts.

Much of this growth and progress is due to the guidance of Mr. E. O. Muncie, who for a period of forty-one years served as Superintendent of Madison Public Schools, and Mr. Connor K. Salm, Principal of Madison High School for thirty-six years. This year we welcome Mr. Myrwin W. Anderson and Mr. H. Brooklyn Cull to our school as Principal and Assistant Principal, respectively, to work with Mr. George Cook, Superintendent, for continued progress of Madison Consolidated High School.






