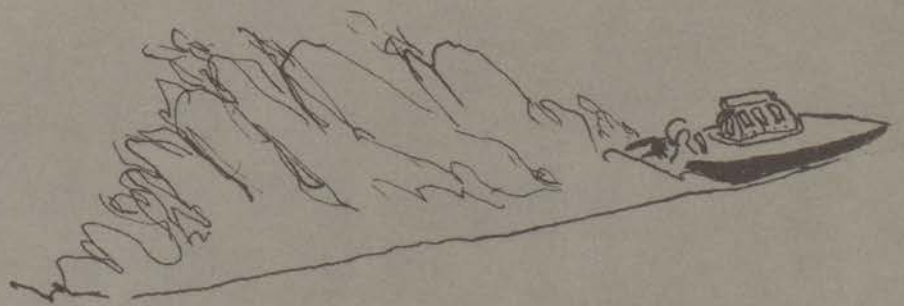

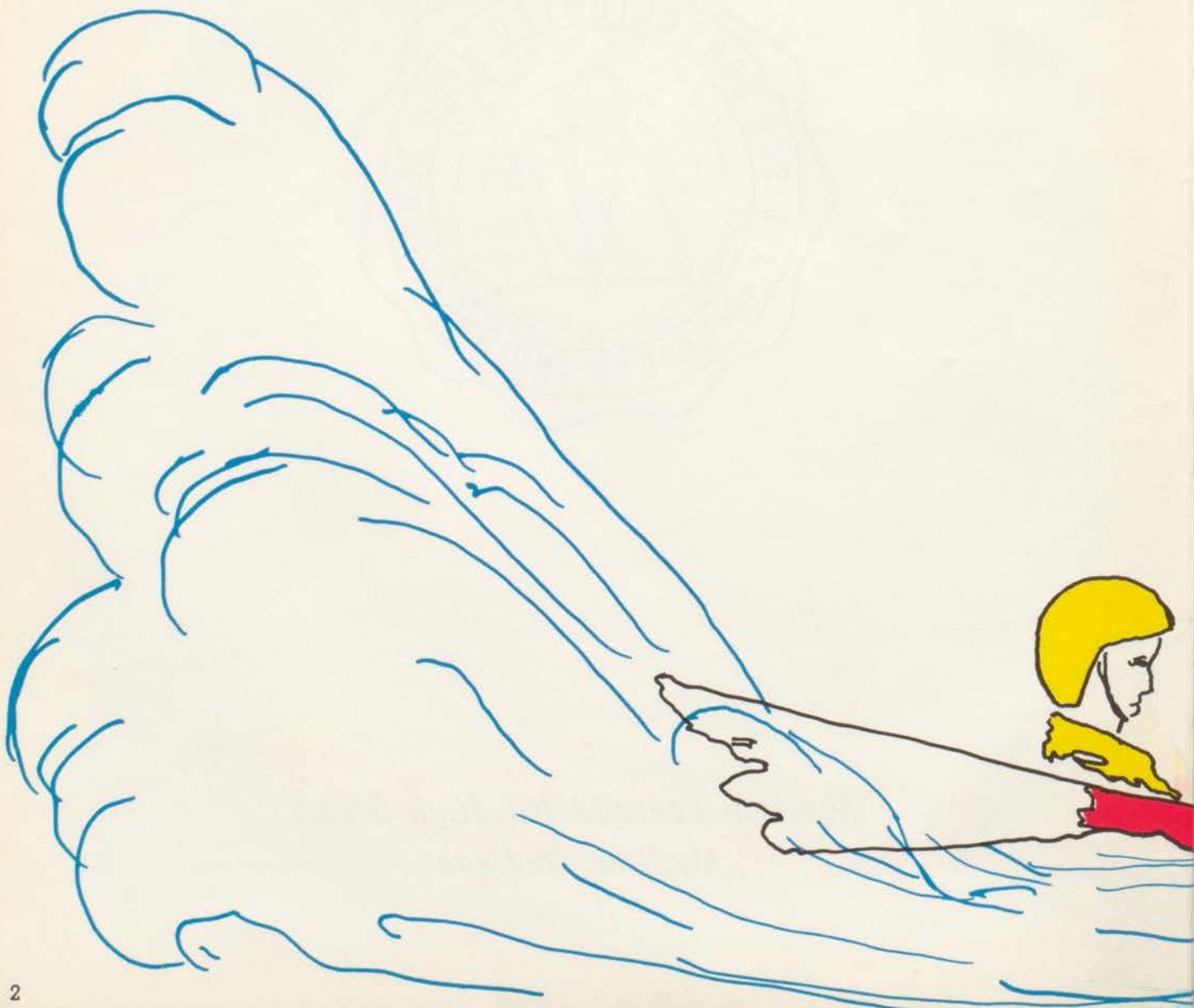

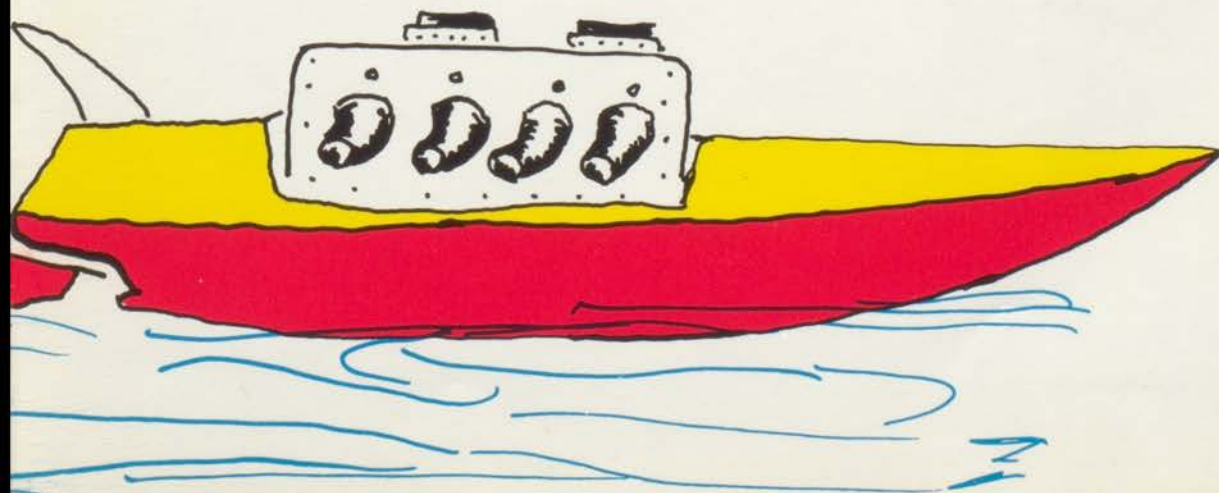

The profound grief felt by America's youth upon the death of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy has been sincere and ingenuous. He was loved and trusted by many people. His laconic wit, alert intelligence, and easy charm endeared him to those who knew him; his kindness, consideration, and strength imbued people with loyal faith in his honesty and integrity. The casualness, the calm precision, the slight sense of detachment from emotion, the invariable courtesy, and the inextinguishable gaiety could not conceal the intense passion, concern, and commitment that pervaded the soul of the President.

The deaths of Abraham Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt were indeed great national tragedies. But their deaths came when they were near the consummation of their work; victory and success were just around the corner. There is greater pathos in John Kennedy's death, for he had so many plans to perpetrate, so much to give to the world. In his words, "We have made a beginning--but we have only begun."

Few people were more devoted to the support of educational development than President Kennedy. He realized that "Our progress as a nation can be no swifter than our progress in education. . . There is an old saying that the course of civilization is a race between catastrophe and education. In a democracy such as ours, we must make sure that education wins the race." We the members of the Mahisco staff acknowledge President Kennedy's energetic endeavors not only in the field of education, but also in the innumerable other areas in which he worked so assiduously, and have therefore chosen "Charging for Progress" as our theme in his memory.
