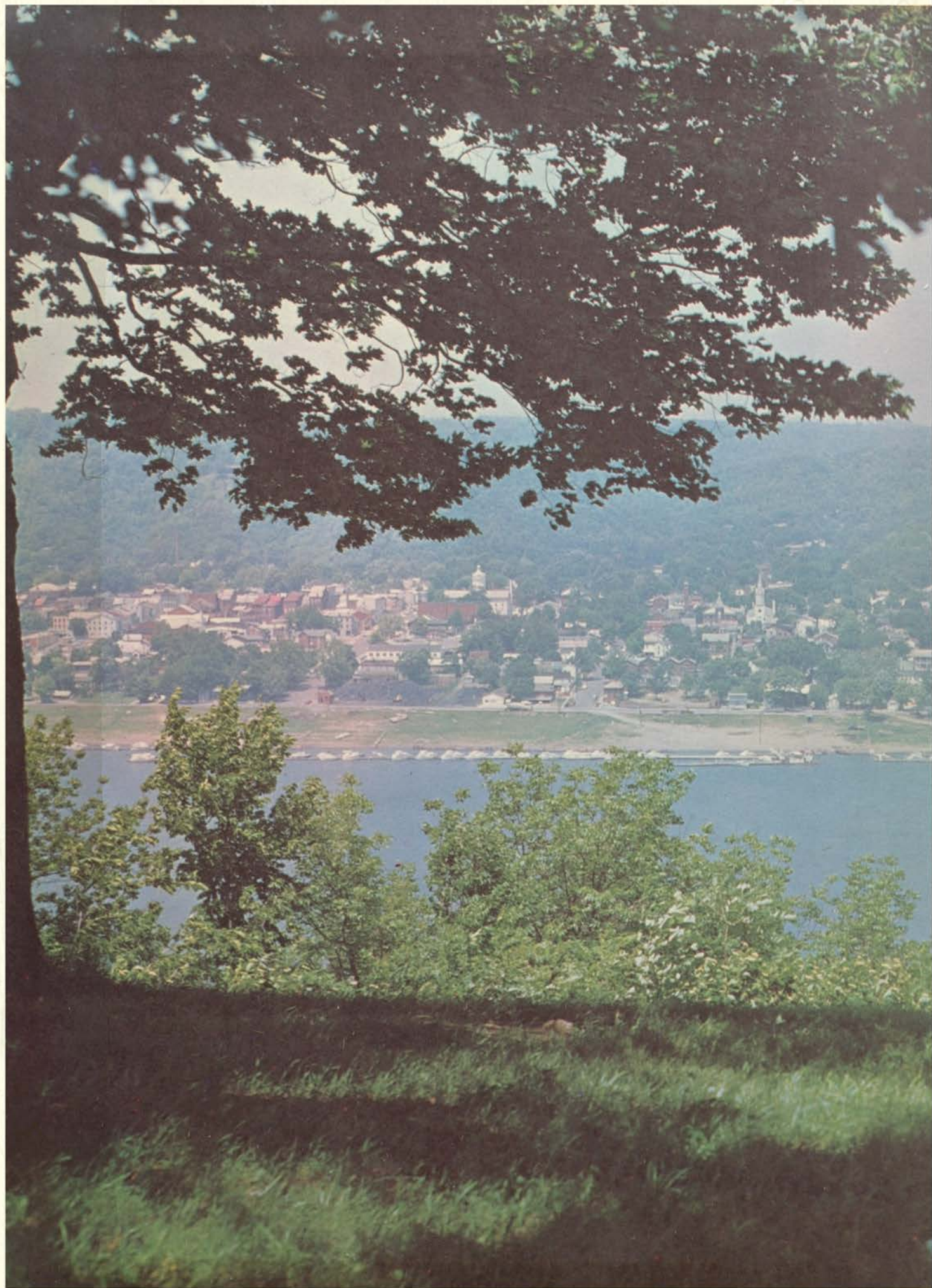
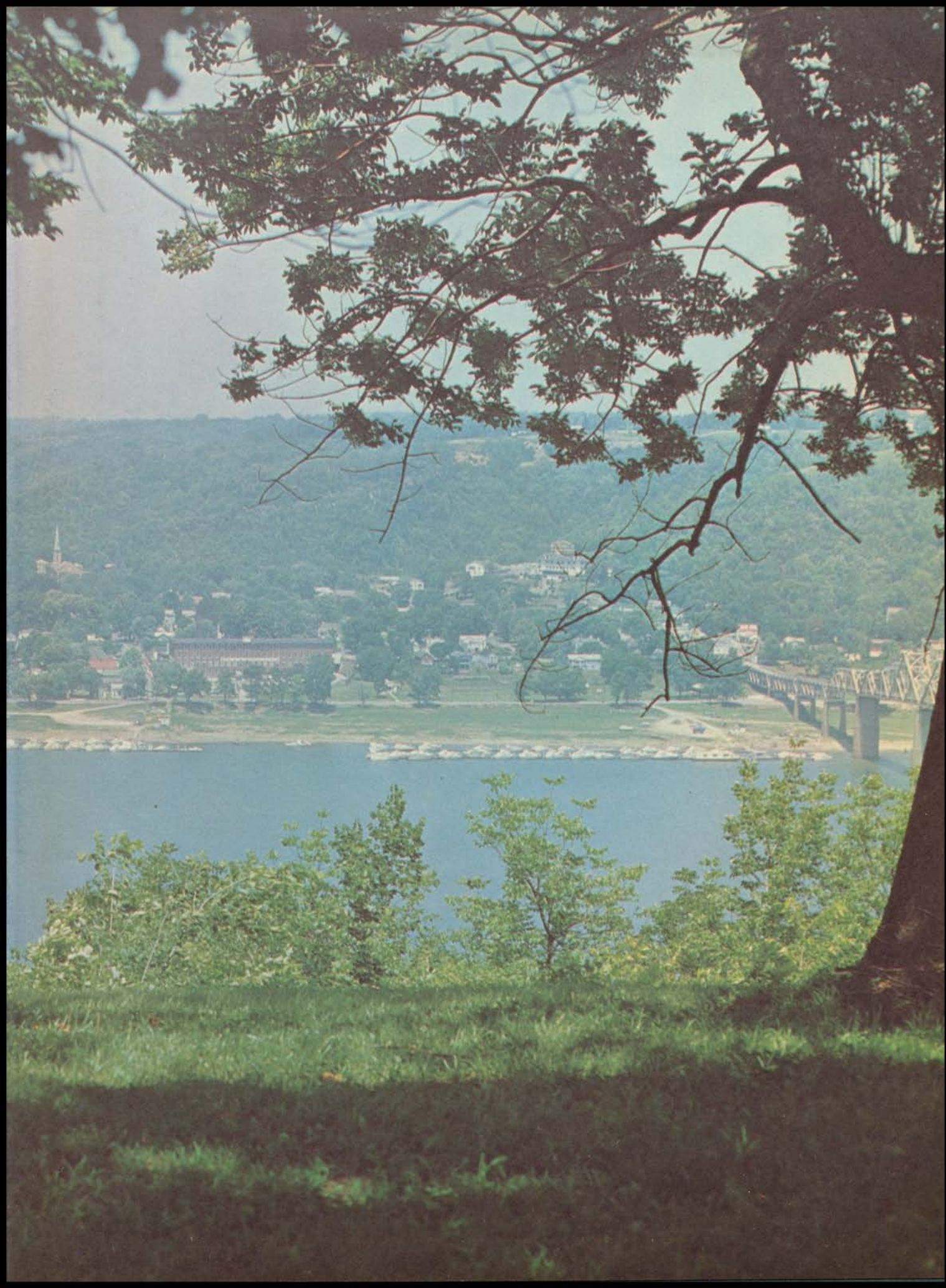

Roots of Wisdom

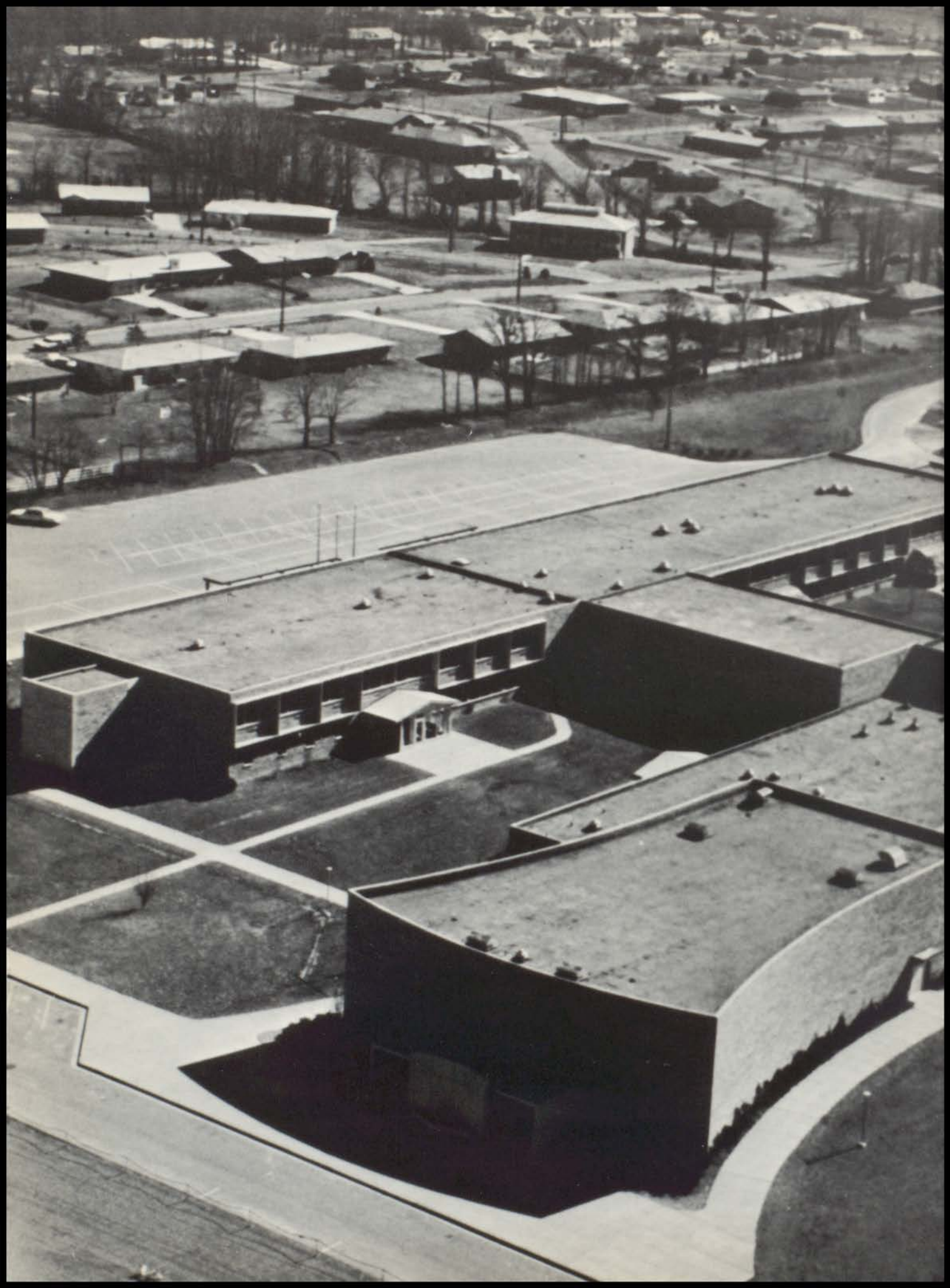



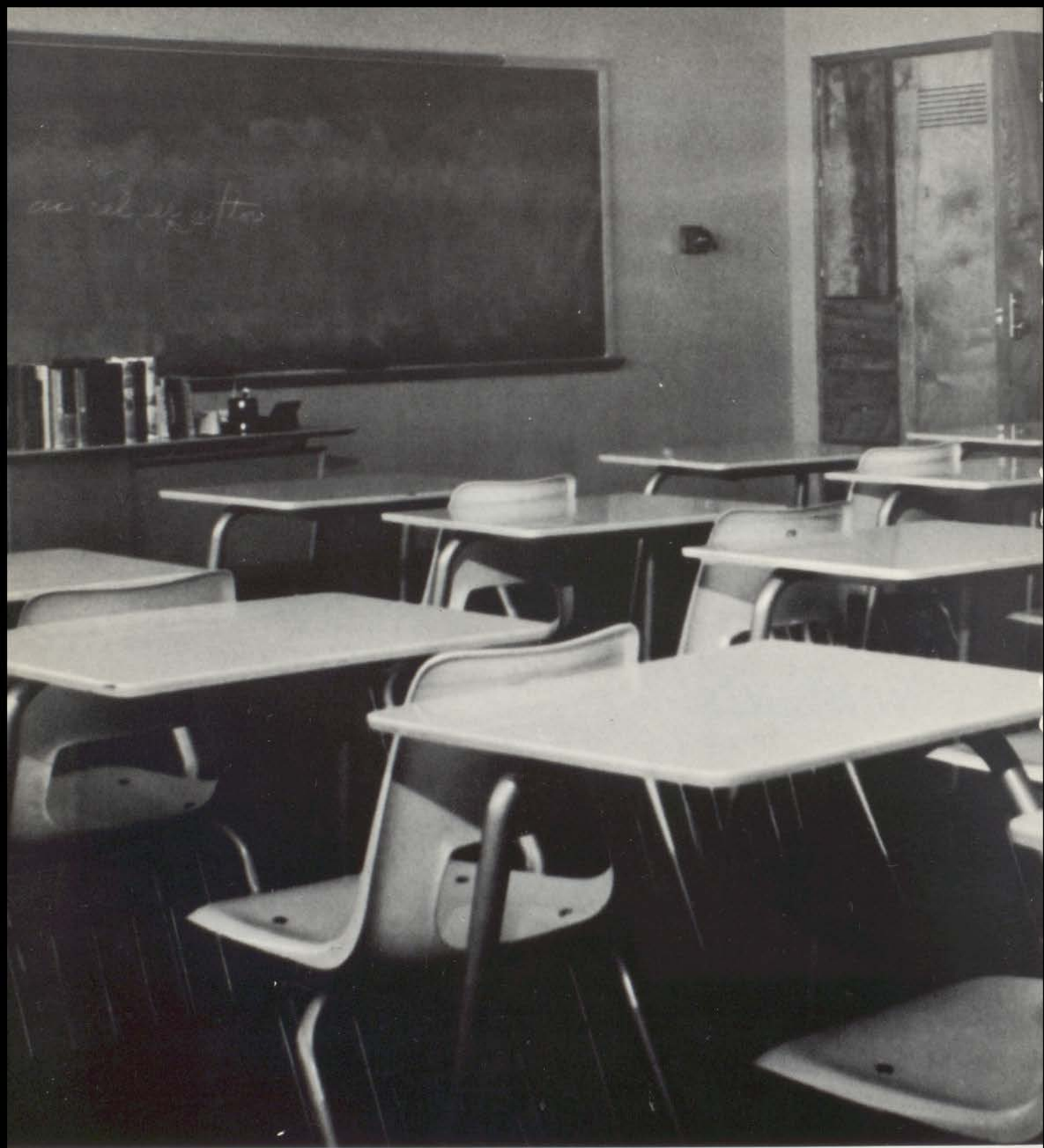

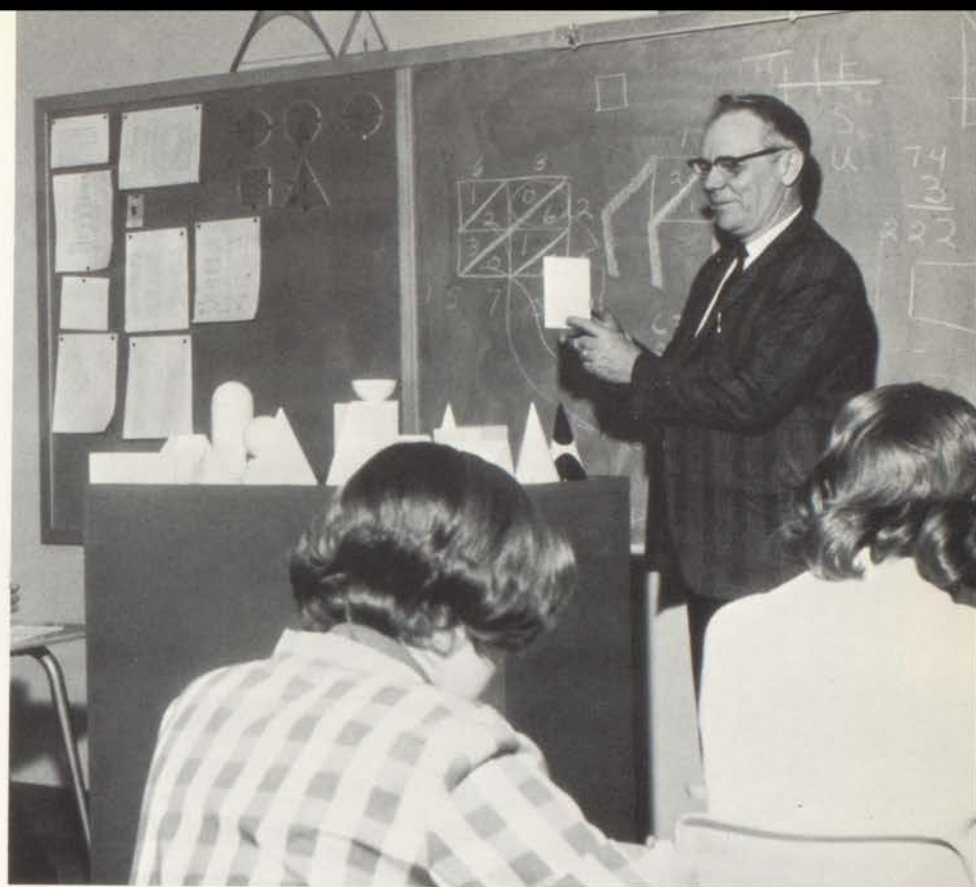

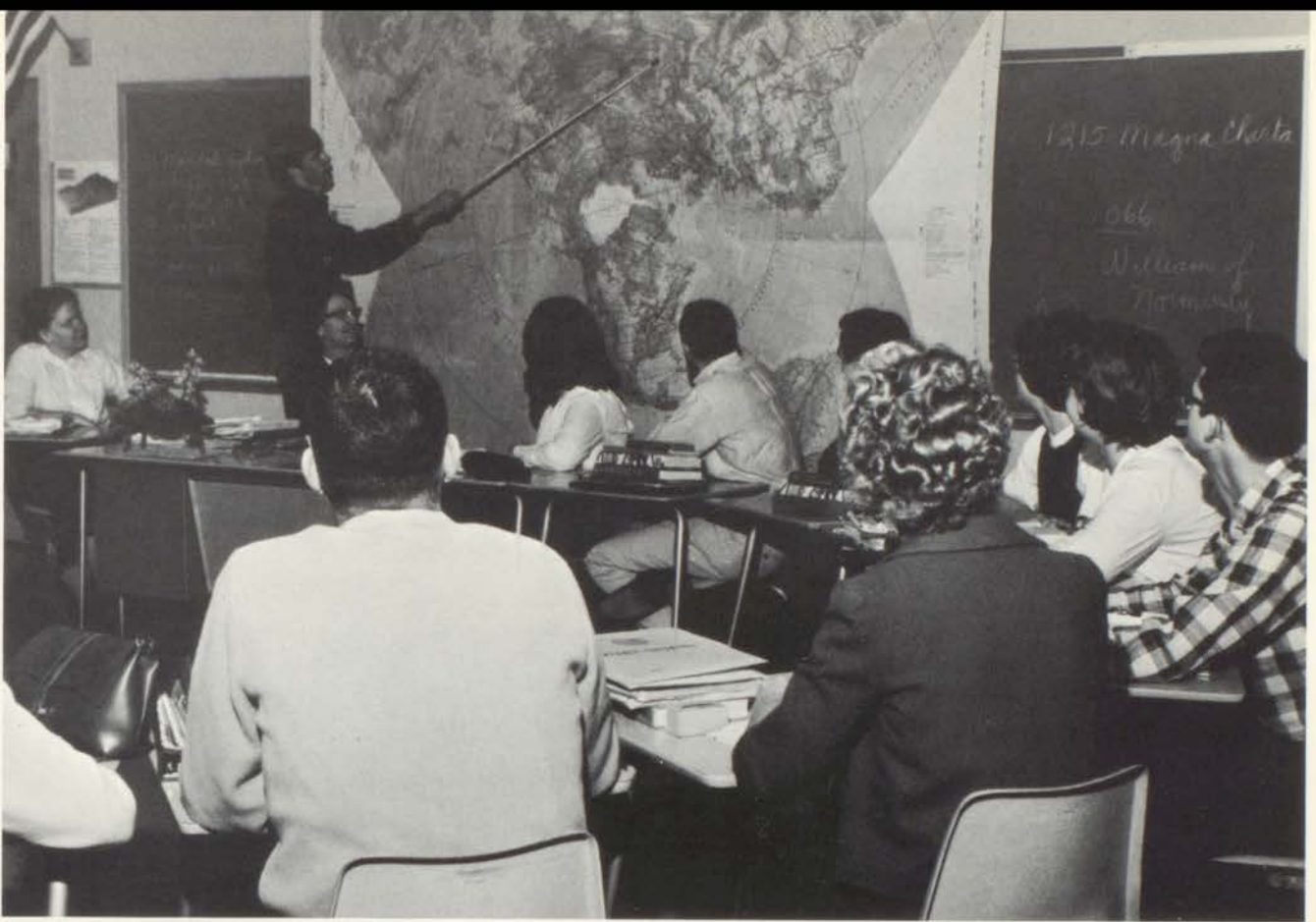

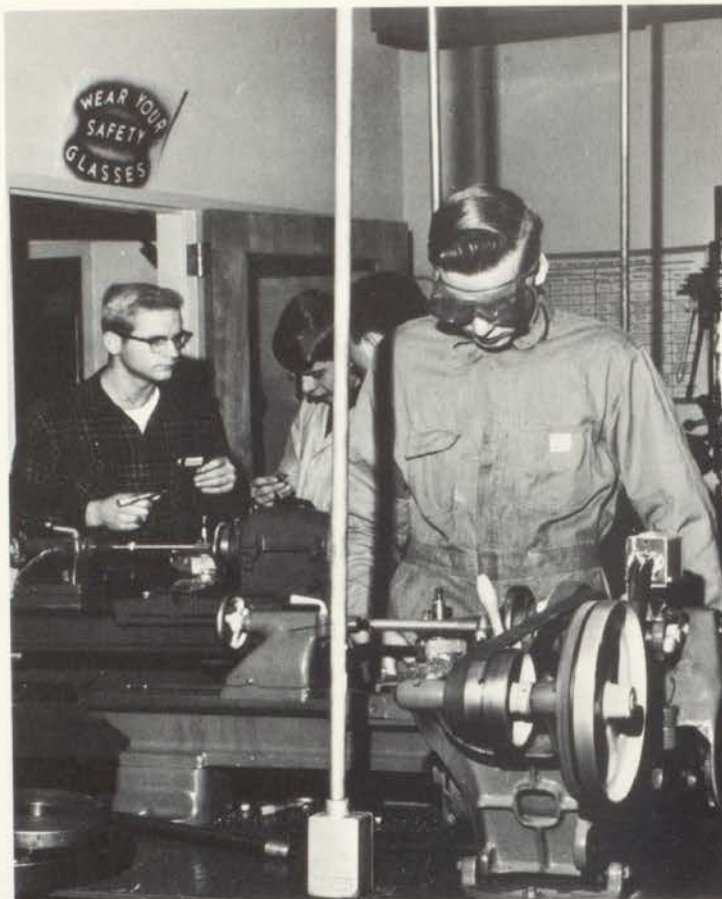

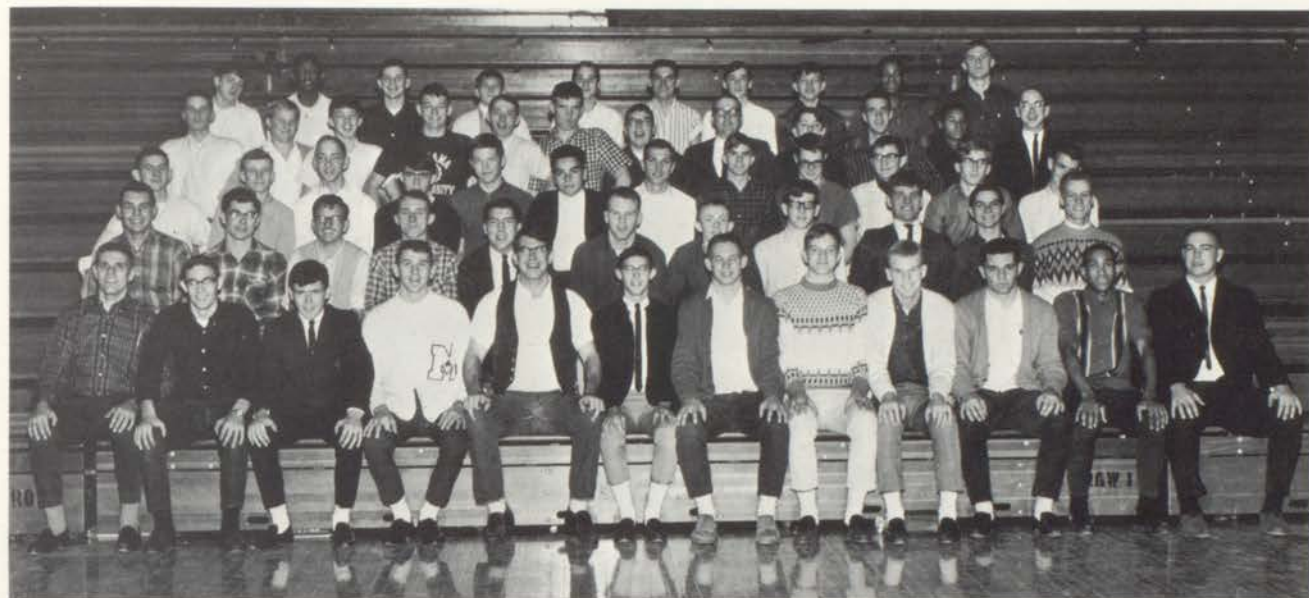

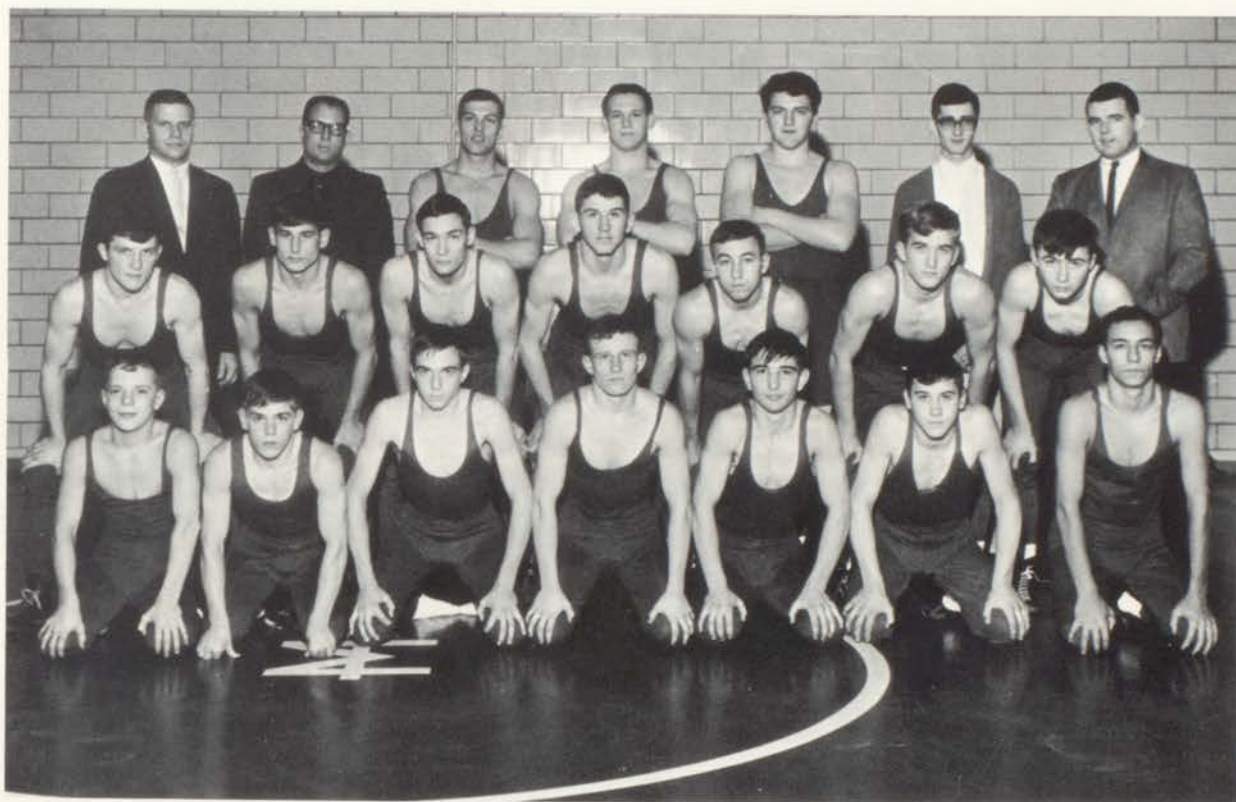
