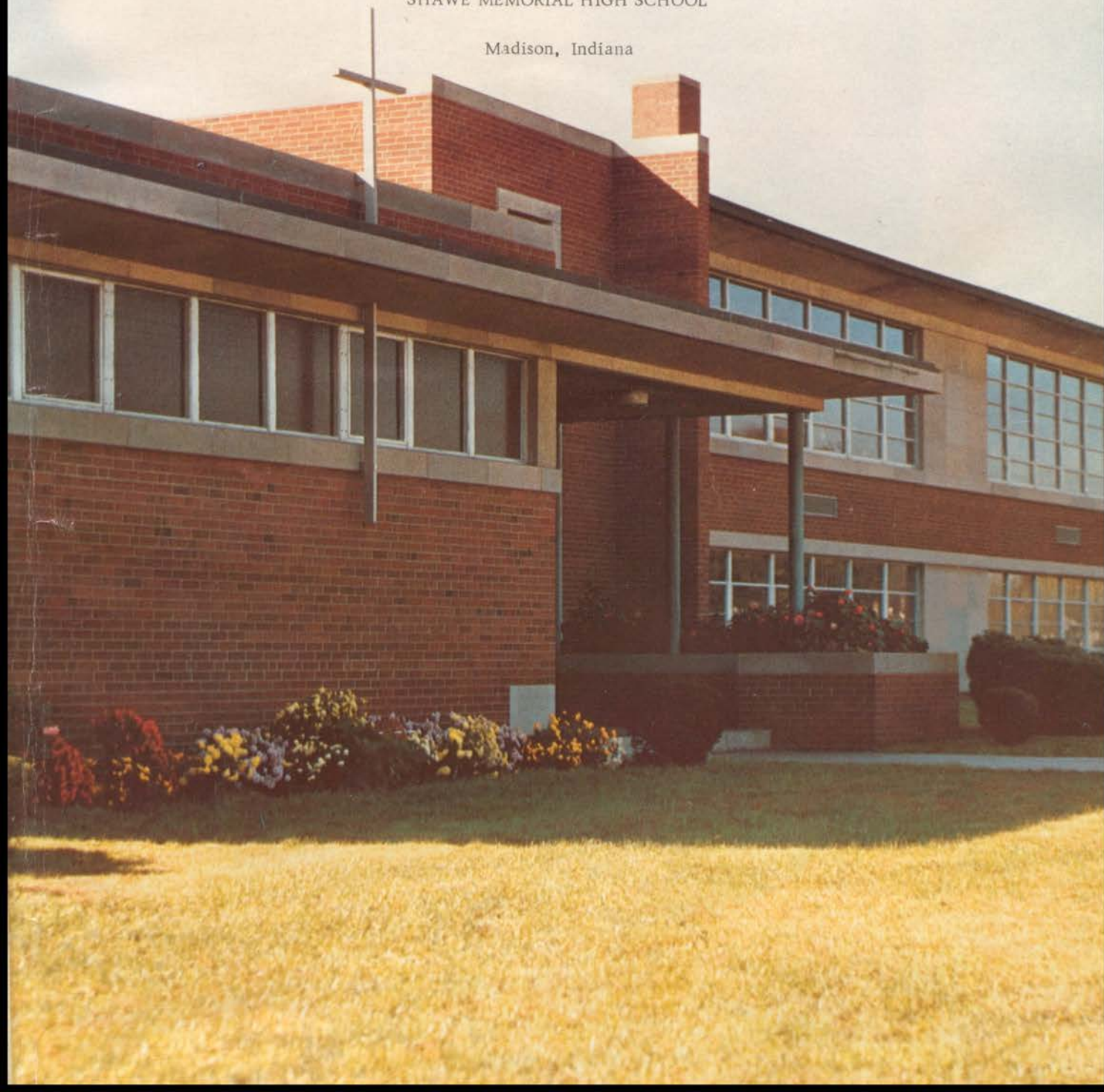

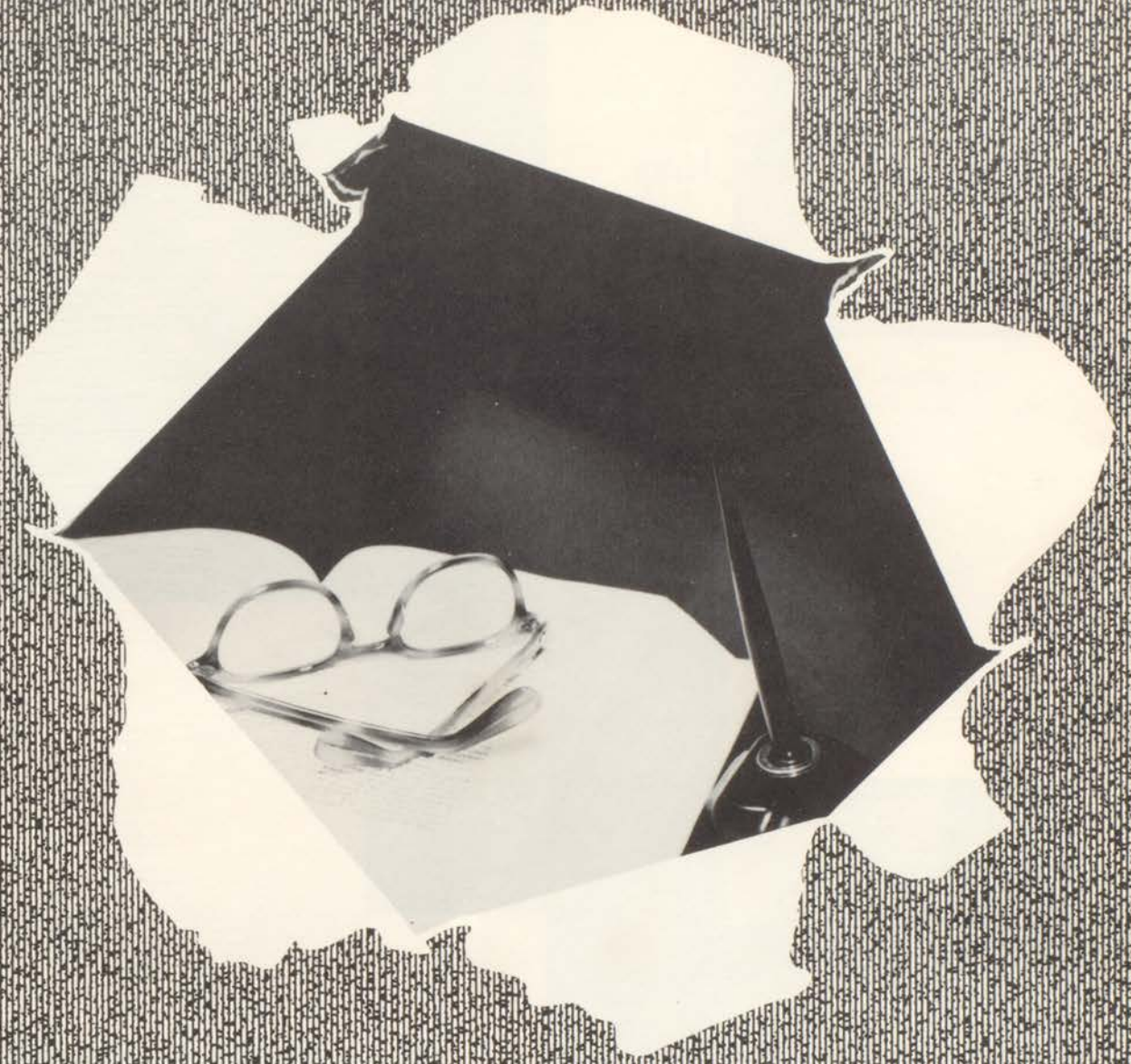
We wish Sister all the happiness and success she so richly deserves, and we pray that God will bless her and all her endeavors in the years to come.

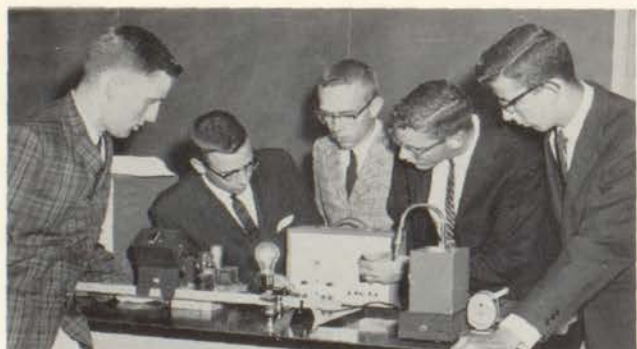

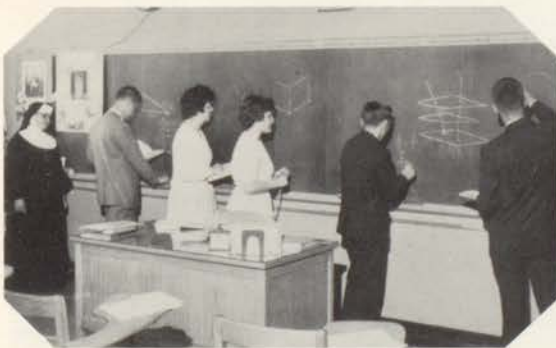

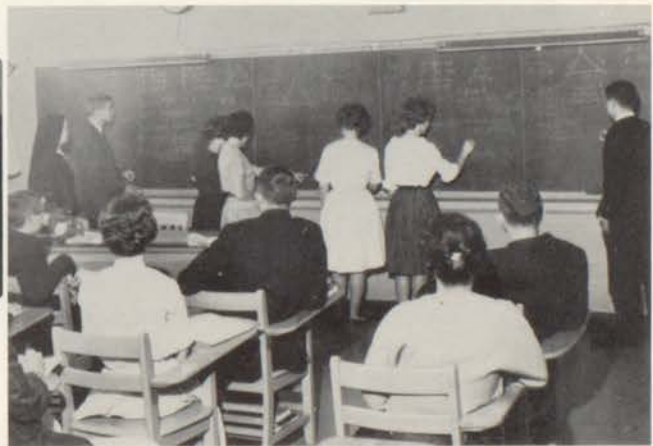

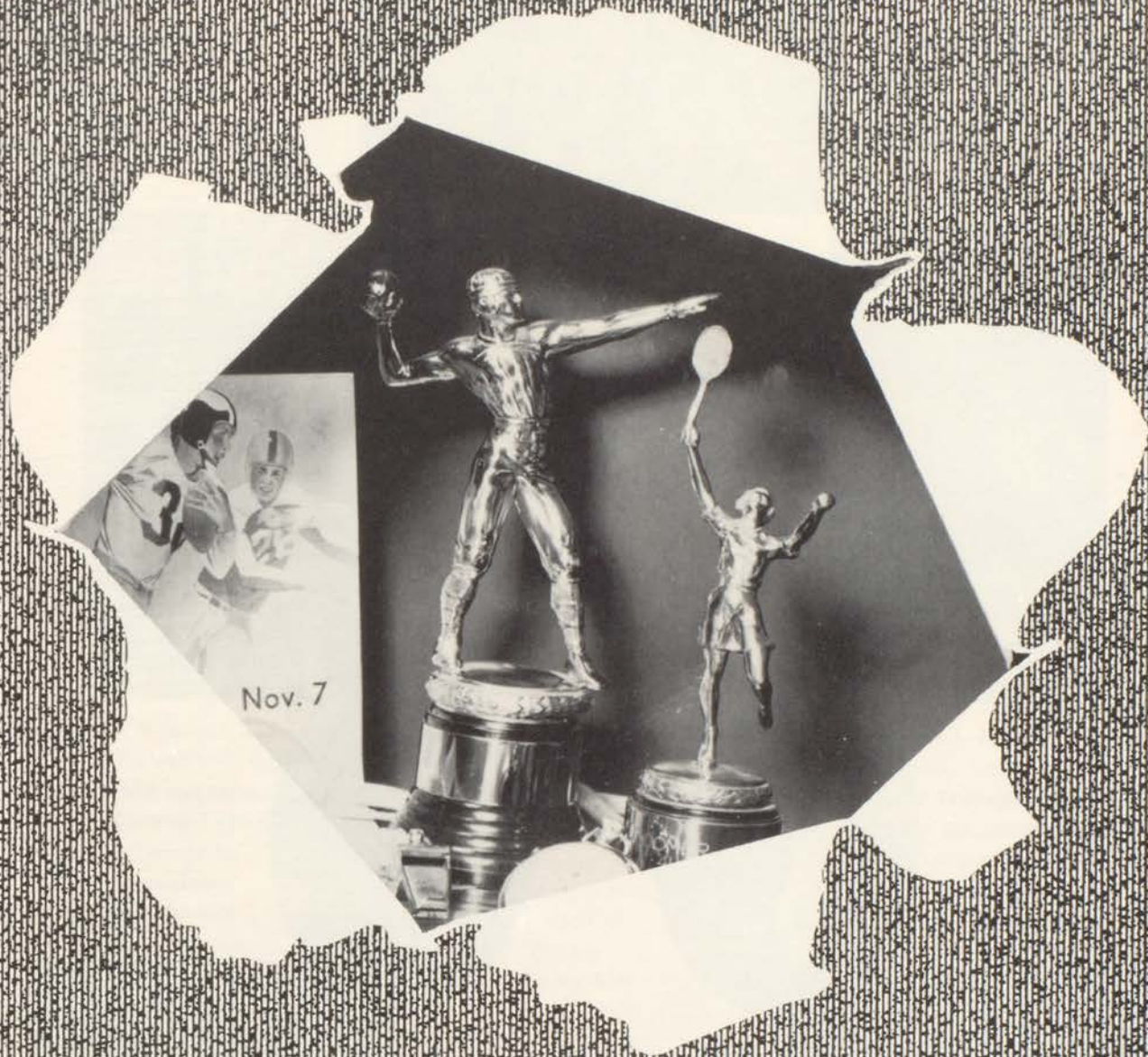

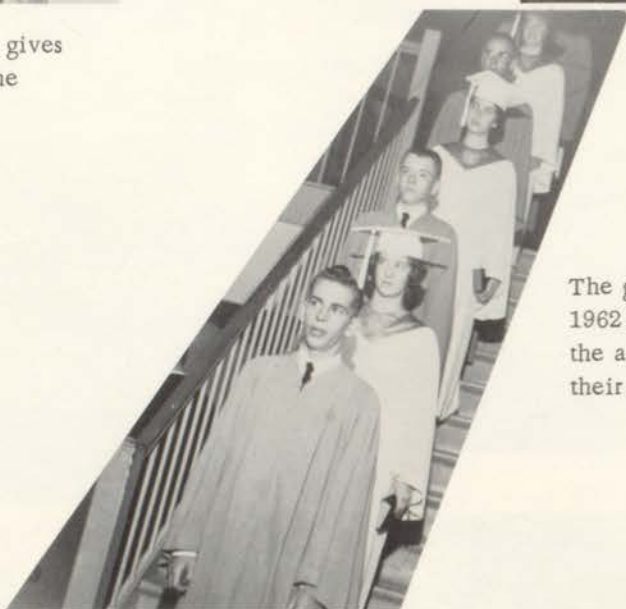

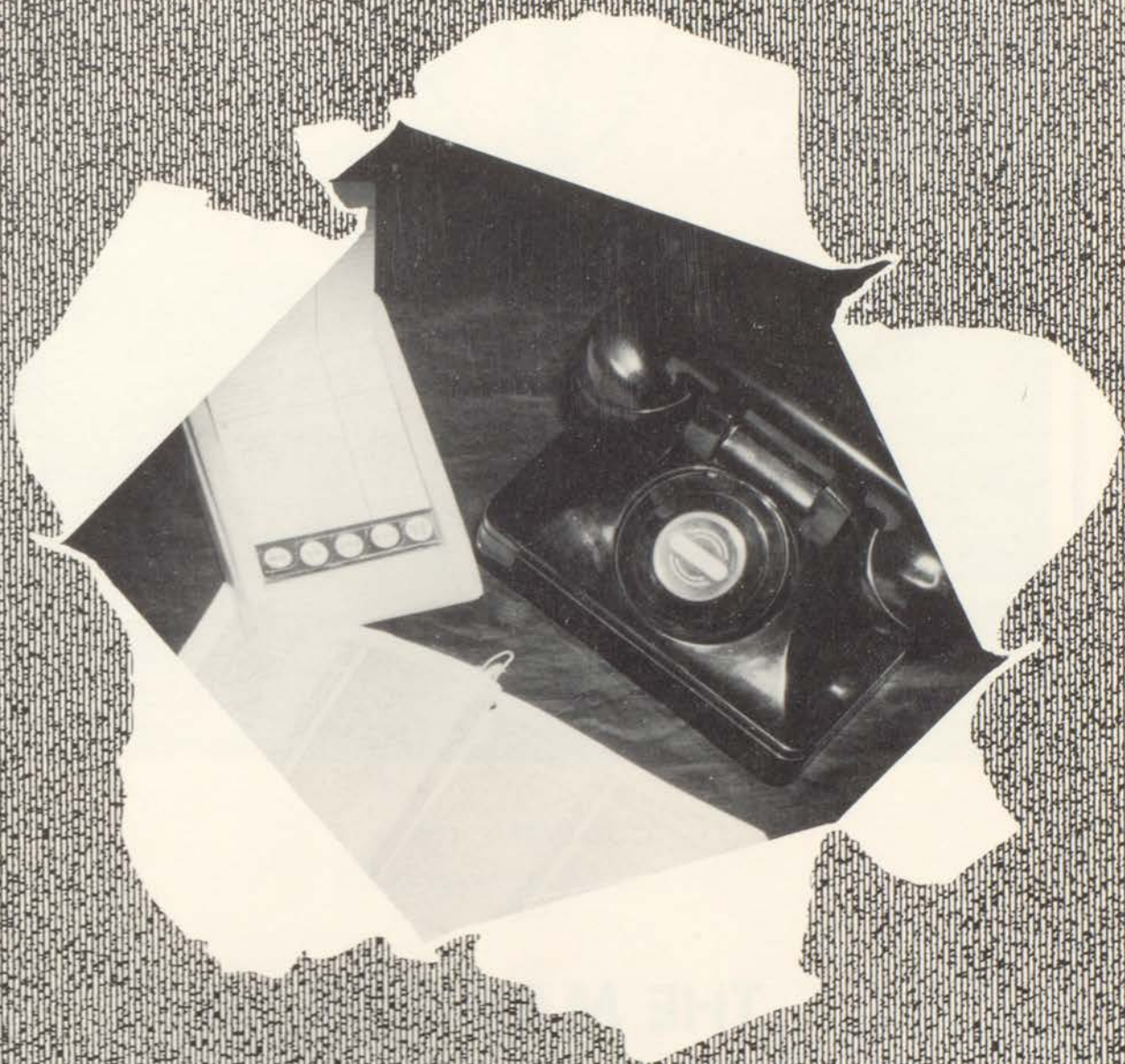
